gnoramus and Mastermind. The increasing friendliness of digital technology has divided its users into these two groups. The first, overwhelming majority consists of those simpletons who only use computers. And the second is composed of all-knowing specialists who develop the technology—programmers, designers, hardware engineers.

In such a clearly polarised world, there appears to be no third group.

Your local assembler sets up a new PC and all you need to begin is to click on the 'Start' button. Three-click-online Internet connections are being sold at ration shops and your computer comes pre-installed with idiot-proof movie playing software.

But what about those who love to tinker? Who are driven by the need to learn more? In a world designed for the convenience of digital dimwits, can this third group exist? Indeed, it can. And it does.

Universities or industry alone did not power the scientific advancement of countries like the United States. The spirit of exploration engendered in their children fuelled it. This is in contrast to our own culture that frowns upon tinkering. Drummed into us since childhood through maternal admonitions like "Munna! Papa ka stereo mat touch karo!"

This censure becomes our theme song. We never really 'learn' to use common applications like Microsoft Word. We drift into them. A friend or colleague helps us get started, and after we learn enough to help us type, format and print, we seldom go beyond. Never "...*touch karo*" anything but the essential. So we deny ourselves the value of Auto Correct, of Track Changes, of Embed Hyperlinks. Simply because we never tinker.

Tinkering catalyses the capacity for complex thought. It fertilises ideas. It begets a confidence born of independent action. It results in the joy that only serendipitous discovery can provide.

Tinkering pays practical dividends too. An incremental feature that we conquer may result in an exponential return in productivity. Imagine the modern workplace. Low error-tolerance, high pressure and perpetual deadlines. One person can unleash the unobtrusive 'Forecast' button in the spreadsheet that saves everyone ten hours of pointless effort.

This is why you should learn how to write macros in Word. To insert video in a PowerPoint presentation. To resume an interrupted file download from exactly the point where you were cut off. To faultlessly back up your digital diary on your computer.

So what will you say when you return from office to find that your eleven-year old has taken apart your computer?







But when we do our monthly mailings, about 5 per cent of the mails bounce back from the mailer daemon.

Here is what happens. Some readers give their e-mail ID and then change it, without realising that they have given a different one when they subscribed.

Checking our records, we found that while subscribing you had given your e-mail id as anprban007@yahoo.com but your current one is different.
